St. Anne Catholic Grade School Student Anti-Bullying Policy 1st - 8th Grade

St. Anne Catholic Grade School believes that all students have the right to a safe and Christ-like environment. We further believe we have an obligation to promote mutual respect, tolerance, and acceptance. In light of this, St. Anne has adopted an Anti-Bullying policy.

Bullying or other aggressive behavior toward a student or teacher is strictly prohibited. Bullying is when one child picks on another child again and again (American Academy of Pediatrics, 2012).

There are three types of bullying (American Academy of Pediatrics, 2012):

- † Physical hitting, kicking, pushing, choking, punching
- † Verbal threatening, taunting, teasing, hate speech
- † Social excluding victims from activities or starting rumors about them

Bullying Happens (American Academy of Pediatrics, 2012):

- † At school in the halls, at lunch, or in the bathroom, when teachers are not there to see what is going on
- † When adults are not watching going to and from school or on the playground
- † Through e-mail or instant messaging rumors are spread or nasty notes are sent

Bullying Is Different from Fighting or Teasing (American Academy of Pediatrics, 2012):

- † A bully has power over another child
- † Bullies try to control other children by scaring them
- † Being picked on over and over can make your child a victim
- † Bullying usually happens when other children are watching

Childhood bullying has long been perceived as an inevitable part of growing up (American Academy of Family Physicians, 2004). Yet, the reality is the bullying behavior and consequences are abnormal for a child's age.

We require every parent and student to read this policy, understand, and sign the agreement form. Any student in violation of this policy may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including, expulsion. We ask students to immediately report incidents of bullying to the teacher or principal.

Please sit down with your child/children and read the policy together, discuss it, and have your child sign it. Your signature and date are also needed. Please return the form to the homeroom teacher.
